START HERE

BRAINSTORM BEFORE researching Scholarships

- Create a comprehensive list of your accomplishments.
- Answer the following common scholarship questions:
 - Tell us about yourself.
 - Describe a time you overcame adversity.
 - What do you plan to study in college? Why?

 - Describe how you have demonstrated leadership ability in your community.

NoST OOME

BE THOROUGH DURING the search

- Start with this form. Find FREE scholarship search services.
- Seek out community resources, including community foundations, community groups, cultural organizations, employers, places of worship and high school counselors.
- Pay attention to qualifications and requirements (EVERY scholarship is different)
- Make a list of scholarships you will apply for.
- Prioritize your list by deadline.
- Add details of all materials required for submission.

COMPLETE your applications

- Work on ONE scholarship at a time.
- Reread specifications of the essay.
- Create an outline using your brainstorm topics.
- SHOW the reader; don't just TELL them
- Use SPECIFIC examples.
- Write multiple drafts. NEVER submit a first draft essay.
- Proofread! Proofread! Proofread! Have a trusted adult or a peer read over your final draft prior to submission.

Time to SUBMIT!

- Make sure your application has ALL required documents.
- Double check that your essay answered ALL prompts given.
- Make a copy! Always keep a record of your submissions.

How to KEEP your scholarship

Some scholarships may be renewable. However, renewable awards might have ongoing requirements, including:

- Submit a renewal application. Scholarships may require a new application each academic year.
- ✓ Grade point average. You may need to maintain a minimum GPA to remain eligible.
- Satisfactory academic progress. You may be required to fulfill academic requirements, such as completing a certain number of credits or courses within a set amount of time.
- Designated field of study. Will you lose the award if you change majors?
- Full-time enrollment status. Scholarships frequently require you to be a full-time student.

If there is any question whether your scholarship is renewable, talk to your school or scholarship sponsor as soon as you receive the scholarship. Remember that sponsors offer scholarships throughout the year!

- · Must register with College Prowler
- · Deadline: Last business day of each month
- Scholarship awarded monthly through random drawing (one-time)

AXA Achievement Scholarship

- High school seniors planning to enroll at an accredited 2- or 4-year institution within the U.S.
- Demonstrate ambition and self-drive evidenced by outstanding achievement in school, community, or work-related activities
- Deadline: December 15
- \$10,000 (one-time)
- · One winner from each state

Coca-Cola Scholars Program Scholarship

- 3.0 GPA
- Transcript, community activities and employment record required for first round
- · Deadline: October 31, 2016
- · 250 Regional finalists will interview
- 2,200 Semi-finalists must submit additional materials

- Must be a junior or senior in high school or a college student and a U.S. citizen
- Must have a minimum 2.5 GPA
- · One short essay required
- · Deadline: Last business day of each month
- \$500 award (one-time, awarded monthly)

Education Matters Scholarship

- · Must be at least 13 years of age
- Must be a U.S. resident
- One short essay required
- Deadline November 30
- \$5,000 award (one-time)

Horatio Alger Michigan Scholarship

- Must be a high school senior and a Michigan U.S. citizen planning to enter a U.S. college the fall after graduation
- Must be involved in co-curricular and community service activities
- Family income (AGI) must be \$55,000 or below
- Display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity
- Must have a minimum 2.0 GPA
- Four essays required
- Deadline: October 25
- 15 \$17,000 scholarships

- 3.5 BPA SAT 1200 ACT 26 Demonstrated financial need – Leadership – Desire to help others
- Application available September 2016
- Deadline: November 2016
- Includes college transition advising
- Up to \$40,000 per year at four-year accredited undergraduate school, any area of study
- · 30-40 recipients annually

Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship

- Graduating, minority high school senior
- Plan to attend an accredited and approved four-year institution within the U.S.
- Show leadership potential, dedication to community service, and demonstrate need
- Minimum 1,000 combined math and critical reading score on SAT or 21 composite ACT score
- Application available November 1, 2016
- Deadline: February 15, 2017
- Awards up to \$24,000 over four years

Kid's Chance of Michigan

- Must be a Michigan resident between the ages of 17-22 and demonstrate financial need
- Parent must have sustained a catastrophic injury or fatality in a Michigan work-related accident covered by workers' compensation
- Rolling deadline
- Awards range from \$2,500-\$5,000 (can apply each year)

The Nordstrom Scholarship

- · Must be a high school junior
- Live and attend high school in one of the participating states designated by Nordstrom
- Participated in community or volunteer activities
- Have and maintain a cumulative unweighted GPA of at least 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale) in high school
- Plan to apply for financial assistance
- Be eligible to attend a four-year college or university in the U.S.
- If awarded, attend an accredited four-year college or university in the U.S. throughout the scholarship
- · Deadline: May 1
